February 1930, Bellefontaine Examiner.

Announcement that the gift of tower chimes to the First Presbyterian church of this city by H.K. Hubbard and Miss Ada Hubbard has been materially increased, was made to members of that congregation Sunday morning by Judge John C. Hover, member of the chimes committee, selected by the donors to have charge of the installation of the tower chimes.... Judge Hover, Fred C. Spittle and Charles Hockett are the committee who are acting on behalf of Mr. Hubbard and his sister.

Judge Hover was quoted as saying, "Our church never had a bell, at least if it did have, it was before my time."

Imagine a church not having a bell! Don't we all think of it as being a long rope that must be pulled with the operator hanging on for dear life as he flies up and down with the flowing sound? What fun!!

These chimes were revolutionary for Bellefontaine! What began as a dream of music among families in the church became a reality when a contract was signed to install a set of 10 chimes in the bell tower.

Upon investigation, the committee learned that only 10 chimes were of limited range musically and could not produce all hymns and national airs of the time.

With further inquiry, it was established (he stressed with no pressure from the company) "a set of 16 chimes, costing considerably more, covers a greater range of music, taking in nearly all of the hymns as they are known and played on the pipe organ and other instruments as well as essentially all of the national airs."

As Mr. Hubbard and sister had relocated to Florida, a letter was prepared and forwarded explaining the difference. To the great pleasure of the committee, a contract for a set of 16 chimes came back, signed and ready to deliver to the company.

The difference between bells and chimes is in the casting. Where bells are formed as a bell would be, these chimes are formed as tubes or pipes. (Think a concert band set of chimes which are suspended by thin cable.)

The pipes are able to be played directly from the pipe organ or from a separate smaller keyboard. Player Pianolike rolls of music deliver melodies automatically by attachment to a timer. A generator is used to move the chimes up and down to strike the musical tones.

When our chimes ceased to ring, efforts to restore them were postponed as much research needed to be done to find out what was required for repair. Who would have thought that one of the few technicians for such an instrument could be located in Galion Ohio when most others live west of the Mississippi!

With a gracious contribution from **Joanne Ritter**, in memory of her beloved husband **Jerry**, the generator was repaired. The Property Committee then contacted Mr. Joe Manley for a consultation for moving ahead. Mr. Manley deemed the chimes in good shape with thoughts on some minor issues that our property guys were able to take care of.

And so, we have music. Music to ring out from our beautiful Gothic Tower. Music to ring out for all of the City to hear. Music to ring out to honor our Father and Savior.

Not bad for being nearly 100 years old! Here's to nearly 100 years more!!




