Proud of our nation, they answered her call, Defending the freedom and safety of all. On land or on sea, or in jets high above They went out of duty, and honor and love.



With the retirement of an Assistant Fire Chief, the 23-year veteran has taken up that role with great pride.


Mayor Ben Stahler remarked "We thankfully could turn to Ben to take on this role. He is a well-respected member of our First Responder Team as well as our community."

He enjoys visitors and would love to take you for a walk when you visit!!




Congratulations Finley Reed!!
