# DID YOU KNOW?

## How does the daylight savings work?

On the second Sunday of March, at 2 a.m., clocks in most of the United States and many other countries move forward one hour and stay there for nearly eight months in what is called Daylight Savings Time. On the first Sunday of November, at 2 a.m., clocks fall back an hour to standard time.

# What is the real reason for Daylight Savings Time?

Longer and lighter days were supposed to save energy, reduce traffic accidents and help people become more active. But clocks really started to roll back when in 1916, when Germany became the first country to observe daylight saving time **to conserve fuel**, according to the Congressional Research Service.

# What is the logic behind Daylight Savings Time?

The true reason why DST was created was to create a way to save energy and to get more use out of our natural daylight.

# What would happen if we get rid of Daylight Savings Time?

If clock changes were abolished, what would happen first? We'd reduce schedule disruptions and having to remember which clocks auto-update. Without losing an hour of sleep in March, you'd probably wake up feeling more refreshed and less tired than on that same weekend in past years.

### Why can't we stay on Daylight Savings Time all the time?

Either Congress has to enact a federal law, or a state or local government has to get permission from the U.S. Secretary of Transportation to stay on permanent standard time — which is what the U.S. observes between November and March — not permanent daylight savings time.

# Which president started Daylight Savings Time?

Though President Franklin D. Roosevelt relaunched it in 1942, the time change wasn't official until 1966, when President Lyndon Johnson signed a law to make the start and end dates of Daylight Savings Time uniform across the country.

# Do other countries do Daylight Savings?

Only about a third of the world's countries practice daylight saving time, and the vast majority of them are in Europe. Within Europe – as defined by the United Nations – only Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Iceland, Russia and Turkey do not practice daylight saving time.

Church. Each year,1<sup>st</sup> UPC folks who have named 1<sup>st</sup> UPC as their charity contribute \$800-\$1000 a year to support our youth mission trips. It only takes a little on your part – but it sure helps our community a lot!
